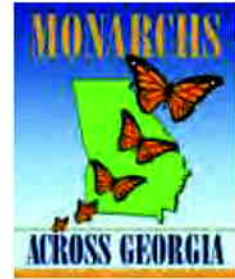


Monarchs Across Georgia Service Award

Nominations must be submitted electronically by June 30, 2009.

Criteria:

Nominations are accepted for an individual or organization whose efforts in the area of monarch education, conservation and/or habitat restoration have made a significant impact in the state of Georgia.

Eligibility:

Eligible for consideration are individuals, non-governmental and governmental organizations, institutions and agencies, for-profit and not-for-profit entities. Nominees are not required to be members of the Environmental Education Alliance of Georgia (EEA).

Instructions:

- Complete a separate [nomination form](#) for each nominee.
- Respond to the following question and statement with respect to each nominee.
 1. Why do you feel the nominee is deserving of this award?
 2. Please describe in 100-250 words what significant contributions this nominee has made to monarch education, conservation and or habitat restoration in the state of Georgia. You may attach supporting documents.
